



MODEL ROCKETEERS AT THE OPENING SESSION



Following the teachers' convention, Bob and Norm traveled to ston and the Manned Spacecraft


Center. With an orientation tour they observed "where the action is" for our man on the moon program. They also saw astronauts Borman, Armstrong, Conrad and Collins.

its model rocketry program. Other contacts during the trip helped assure an expanded model rocket program in the summer Aero-space workshops.


Incidently, it was this space center that provided the spacecraft exhibit for our Open House.

MANNED SPACECRAFT CENTER







