



the Launch Pad, we were planning to send a shipment of our "nonflying" scale Saturn V's to Cape Kennedy for the May 18th Apollo 10 launching. Due to the extra efforts of many plant personnel, we were able to send 300 kits and one completed "V" by air freight to the Cape in time for the launch. On the following Monday an additional 300 kits were dispatched by surface mail.

The completed Saturn V was built by Bill See, a member of our Research and Development team. Bob Clark, supervisor of TWA's purchasing department at Kennedy Space Center, was lavish with his praise of the fine workmanship on the model -- in both its design and construction.

After eighteen months of research and development, Bill's "flying version" of the "V" will be presented to the country's model

As noted in the last issue of rocketeers in the new catalog. This model stands 43 inches high and is one one-hundredth the size of NASA's big bird. Over forty of its parts are plastic, including the command module, the escape tower, the ullage motors and other outer parts. Over thirty-five test flights have proven its stability and dependability.

> At least ten pages of instructions are being arranged to guide the rocketeer in building the model. Over sixty drawn illustrations are used, and the drawing to scale of the embossed wrap-arounds and decals have required a great deal of time and patience. Also, before the plastic parts could be molded, threedimensional sketches of each piece had to be prepared.

> The development of the Estes scale models has been one of the most exciting aspects of model rocketry. They have allowed rocketeers to feel like genuine members of the space team.


