



consecutive calendar days prior to February 22 are also eligible to receive holiday pay for the equivalent of eight (8) hours work.






The new supervisor in the Shipping Department is Lucille Ossola, a resident of Florence. She has been with the company since November, 1965.



Orders that are to be mailed, such as gifts, should be given to Oakie Six in the Mail room along

with payment for the items ordered. The company has recently assumed the responsibility of paying shipping charges on employee orders to any destination in the United States, U.S. territories or possessions, including APO or FPO addresses.

The revised order blanks may be obtained from the shift supervisor or the Retail Store.


Your job is important - don't think it is not - So try hard to give it the best that you've got! And don't think ever you're of little account - Remember, you're part of the total amount.
